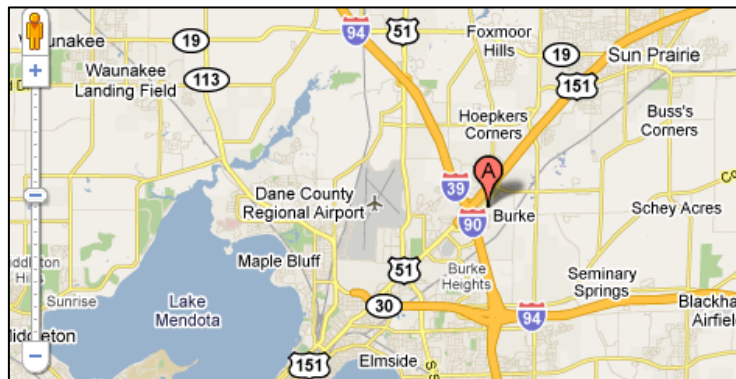

Forklift Classroom Training Course

OSHA regulation 1910.178 states only trained and authorized operators shall be permitted to operate a powered industrial truck. Attendees of this two hour course will learn about safe operating rules, inspection and maintenance, engineering principles, loading and unloading, and safe refueling practices. Handouts along with a written test will be given.

OSHA requires operators to receive training in the topics which are applicable to the safe operation of the truck in the employer's workplace. A certificate and pocketcard will be issued once a hands-on evaluation on the forklift is conducted by a knowledgeable evaluator from the attendee's company. If the company does not have a person to perform the site evaluation, Safety Compliance Associates, LLC can send an evaluator to the operator's location to complete the hands-on evaluation. The minimum fee of \$150 plus mileage for this service for up to five employees would vary depending on location. Contact us for an exact cost.

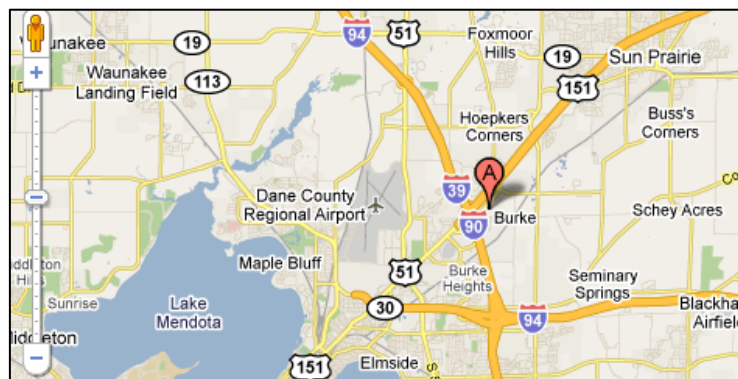
